The Clover School District Board of Trustees met on Monday, February 27, 2017 at 6:00pm for executive session and open session at 7:00 pm. Board members in attendance were Chairman-Mack McCarter, Vice-Chairman-Joe Gordon, Secretary-Sherri Ciurlik, Board Members-Liz Johnson, Ginger Marr, Rob Wallace and Jay Young.

Others in attendance included Superintendent Marc Sosne, Assistant Superintendents Ken Love and Pam Cato, Executive Director Mark Hopkins, Executive Human Resources Director Millicent Dickey, Public Information Officer Bryan Dillon, Facilities Director Lyle Miller, and Board Attorney Franklin Pendleton. Cumming Project Manager Kelly Clayton was in attendance for the Open Session only.

In accordance with the South Carolina Code of Laws, 1976, Section 30-4-80(d), as amended, *The Rock Hill Herald* was notified of the time, date, place, and agenda of this meeting. An agenda was posted at the meeting site and on the school district Web Site.

OPEN SESSION

Chairman McCarter called the meeting to order at 6:00pm and asked for a motion to convene executive session. ***The motion for executive session was made by Mr. Young and seconded by Mr. Wallace. Motion carried unanimously.***

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

- **DATA DRIVEN INSTRUCTION ~ STUDENT INTERVENTION TEAM (SIT) MRS. KENDA COOK, PRINCIPAL-GRIGGS ROAD ELEMENTARY, MRS. LORI MACZKO, PRINCIPAL-CROWDERS CREEK ELEMENTARY**
Mrs. Cook and Mrs. Maczko shared information relating to how data is used in schools to provide student interventions for students who are not meeting academic growth.
- **2017 - 2018 SCHOOL CALENDAR, MR. BRYAN DILLON, PUBLIC INFORMATION OFFICER**
Mr. Dillon provided additional background information on the development of the 2017-2018 academic calendar. Mr. Dillon presented two new DRAFT calendars for discussion noting that DRAFT C-17 proposes a school start date on August 17, 2017 based on legislation around H.3508. If passed, H.3508 would allow a one-time exception to the state law that currently does not allow a district to start before the 3rd Monday in August. Mr. Dillon recommended DRAFT Calendar C-17 for first reading provided the legislature enacts H.3508 prior to the March 20, 2017 board meeting. **Mr. Gordon made motion to approve DRAFT Calendar C-17 for first reading. Mr. Young seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.**

FINANCE REPORT – MR. KEN LOVE, ASST. SUPERINTENDENT BUSINESS SERVICES

Mr. Love presented the monthly finance report stating that overall we are where we should be at this time of the time. Budget requests for next year's budget are being received.

The district has received a request from Comporium Communications for a ten (10) foot easement on the property to install a new fiber line for internet service. Mr. Love requested approval from the board to grant the ten foot easement with a more direct route on the property for installation of the new fiber line. ***The board unanimously approved the request for the ten foot easement as presented without objections.***

FACILITIES REPORT – MR. LYLE MILLER, DIRECTOR OF FACILITIES

Mr. Miller gave the monthly facilities report which reflected maintenance work orders and completions for November and December.

Mr. Clayton presented the monthly construction report as written and reviewed ongoing construction projects. He is in the process of generating a list for warranty work. State inspections for the Ninth Grade Academy will be held during the week of February 27, 2017.

The board approved the personnel recommendations as presented in executive session by the administration with no objections or concerns.

A motion to adjourn Open Session at 7:40pm and reconvene Executive Session was made by Mrs. Marr and seconded by Mr. Wallace. Motion was unanimous.
